If there is any doubt as to the impact of the United Methodist Camping program, consider the experience of Nathan. As the time approached for camp, he became more and more hesitant to go. In fact, he agreed to go a day late and then only if he could come home a couple days early. When we called to see if he was ready, after a slight hesitation, he asked if he could stay longer - until the end of camp. Of course, he could. When Nathan arrived home, he

said he was glad he went, wanted to be held accountable for decisions he'd made for the Lord and for life changes he wanted to make. Not only that, but Nathan decided he wanted to come back in a couple years and help counsel that same camp and to become a youth leader on the conference level to help other youth in their relationship with the Lord.

What are Charitable Gift Annuities?

A gift annuity is a contract with the Dakotas United Methodist Foundation that, in exchange for a gift, you receive a <u>fixed</u>, <u>life payment</u>. Your rate is based directly on your age. The older you are, the better the rate—<u>up to 11.3%</u>. In addition, you receive an immediate income tax deduction.

When the life or lives of the annuitants end, the remainder of the gift becomes a part of the assets of the Foundation to assist any ministry you have indicated.

A gift annuity can take several forms and we encourage you to seek your own legal and/or tax advice, but the advantages of a gift annuity are:

- The rate is often much higher than a CD, bank account, or many investments.
- You may not have to claim capital gains.
- You may take a tax deduction for the current year and up to five additional years for a portion of the donation.
- A ministry of the Dakotas Annual Conference benefits from your generosity.

The rates for our gift annuities are based on those published by the American Council on Gift Annuities (ACGA)

The amount of the annual, semi-annual, or quarterly payment depends on the size of the gift. The following examples may help.

Example #1

A married couple, both age 74, would receive a guaranteed fixed life payment of 6.2%. If one of the spouses is 80 years of age, the rate would increase to 6.5%.

Anyone who is single would receive the following guaranteed fixed life payments:
